

WOOOOOHOOOO! GOOD NEWS about our Fall Exhibit!!

What a huge success our Fall Exhibit has been!

The sales were A-MA-ZING, coming in over \$5900.

That is record breaking for us!

Our artists were exceptionally pleased with the Parkview room and its beautiful lighting and huge windows. There were smiles on a lot of faces all weekend; we had fun and we supported each other and it showed! The traffic of visitors / potential buyers was constant, and expertly funneled to our out-of-theway location by young DCA volunteers who did their job beyond reproach. The DCA volunteers were critical in our success, as was the fact our artists out did themselves in showcasing absolutely spectacular paintings, small works and cards.

Raffle ticket sales were record breaking as well! The idea of offering a painting as a prize was effective.

Before the raffle even began, our artists raised \$860 by preselling 242 tickets! This approach will be revisited for our next exhibit due to issues and feedback received.

During the 2-day event, we were assertive in greeting visitors at the door and offering the tickets, which proved to be a good strategy. We sold 84 more tickets for an approximate (and conservative) value of \$340, bringing the total foreseen donation in excess of \$1200.

bio. November Artist Olivier Léogane



Beyond his artistic talent, one element that is striking about Olivier Léogane is the duality of his character. Indeed, with a doctorate in chemistry from the University of Montreal, he is an artist in a chemist's body.

To better understand his approach, we need to look at the origin of the choice of the appellation "Horagai". Indeed, in the time of the Samurai, the horagai was a huge shellfish caught at sea. The horagai was carried by a soldier whose sole task was to transmit marching orders. This vector of communication is now the mission of the horagai workshops and Olivier, through the contradiction of his character, ardently wishes to become this messenger in order to share his experience and knowledge, especially among young people.

In this context, Horagai Creations has developed a series of workshops that combine scientific concepts and painting and whose main objectives are to democratize art by combining it with the learning of basic sciences.



It is everyone's responsibility to keep the sketchbook clean, safe, and in good condition.





Congratulations go to Steven Rosati!! ...a local artist!

Earlier this year, the Canadian government asked the Royal Mint and the Bank of Canada to replace the likeness of the Queen with that of the King on its coins and on the \$20 bill.

Following the government's announcement regarding the introduction of a new design, the Mint invited more than 350 Canadian artists and engravers registered in its database to submit a portfolio to its internal review committee.



The Royal Canadian Mint president, Marie Lemay, and Canadian portrait artist Steven Rosati pose beside the first Canadian coin depicting King Charles III unveiled on Tuesday, Nov. 14, 2023 in Winnipeg.

The image used for this purpose was created by Canadian artist Steven Rosati. He has previously created other coins for the Royal Canadian Mint, including six National Hockey League silver goalie coins and a 100th anniversary commemorative dollar honoring the Toronto Maple Leafs.

The very first coins bearing the face of King Charles III will be in circulation in Canada starting in December 2023.
