We are trying something new this year. A double panel is reserved for "Small Works for New Collector". Participating artists may hang one painting, maximum size 8"x10" framed with a maximum price of \$170. If space permits, artists may be able to hang more than one painting.

The intention is to group together ready-to-hang high-quality art as affordable for the first time collector or as a gift for a grandchild, child or self.

Remember to have your business cards ready to hand out to potential customers who aren't sure about a sale or who want to refer you to someone else. If you don't already have cards, you can print a set of cards yourself using ready made business card stock available at Bureau en Gros. You can also have cards professionally printed by a local printing business.

New this year! The Fine Art and Craft Show will be open **3:30 - 6:30 PM on Friday, November 7** for Dollard residents only. (Naturally, exhibitors are not subject to this restriction.) Now, if you are not a resident of DDO and not exhibiting, you will be allowed entry to the show Friday if you **show your signed AAD membership card** at the door.

At **6:30 PM**, the show closes to the public and the exhibitors only will have a chance to circulate for an hour. If you are exhibiting and would like to tour the show on Friday, we recommend that a few exhibitors mind the paintings while the rest tour the venue.

A vernissage will be held at 2:00 PM on Saturday afternoon. We hope to see a great turnout of all AAD members. Come and raise a glass with us.

HOW ARTISTS CAN USE THE SQUARE APP TO PROCESS PAYMENTS

Download & Set Up

- Download the Square Point of Sale app (free) on your phone or tablet.
- Create a Square account and link your bank account for deposits.

Accept Payments In-Person

- Use a **Square Reader** (connects via Bluetooth or headphone jack) to accept credit/debit cards, tap, or chip payments.
- Enter card details manually if the customer doesn't have their card physically.
- A reader is not required to process payments clients can tap your phone, or if payment exceeds the tap limit, you can enter card details manually.

Accept Payments Online or Remotely

- Send invoices directly from the app or dashboard.
- Create a payment link or QR code for quick digital transactions.
- Set up a simple online store or booking page through Square Online.

Track Sales & Inventory

- Square logs each sale, tracks taxes, and provides detailed sales reports.
- You can Categorize items (e.g., paintings, prints, classes) for easier tracking.

Deposits & Fees

- Funds are typically deposited into your bank account within 1-2 business days.
- Square charges a small transaction fee (around 2.6% + 10¢ per tap/swipe/dip).
- No monthly fees or subscription plans—only fees to pay are upon transaction.

Additional Tools

- Option send receipts by text or email.
- Integrates with customer directories, marketing tools, and inventory management.

Just what is poetry, you may ask For the poet, a daunting task

KANDINSKY AND THE SOUND OF COLOUR – by David Brown



Wassily Kandinsky

Wassily Kandinsky was born in Moscow in 1866 and lived until 1944. He was one of the earliest, and is considered to be one of the greatest, pioneers of abstract art. Like other artists of his time, he grappled with the meaning of abstraction in art and with the ways in which it might convey meaning. His progress as an artist was long and slow but as his thought matured he found himself increasingly dedicated to a belief that the best art must have the ability to evoke experiences of inner beauty and spiritual power.





He achieved this by thinking of colours as music and of paintings as musical compositions in which each of the elements 'vibrate', interacting with all the other elements, and thereby elevating the whole to something greater than the sum of its parts.

But this did not mean that Kandinsky ever had a desire to produce "pictures of music." In fact, he believed that the experience of viewing surpassed that of listening because, unlike painting, music happens in time and has a set temporal duration.

Paintings, on the other hand, are silent and eternal. Thus, they have the power to evoke

feelings and experiences that exist beyond the noise, in that place of stillness that exists beyond the din of our everyday lives.

As Kandinsky himself wrote later in life, "Next to the 'real' world, art creates a new world that in its externals has nothing to do with reality. Thus, a new "world of art" is placed next to the "world of nature," a world that is just as real."

AN INTERESTING VISIT IN LITTLE ITALY – By Karen Sciortino









On October 17, I had a tour of Little Italy with a professional tour guide. One of the highlights was seeing Chiesa Madonna Della Difesa (Our Lady of La Difesa Church). What a masterpiece! This unusual church with a distinctive brick facade was designed by Italian-Canadian Guido Nincheri who also designed the spectacular stained-glass windows AND who painted the fresco in the dome.¹

While the fresco in Eglise Notre-Dame-de-la-Defense is very well done, it's most unusual claim to fame is the inclusion of Benito Mussolini and his entourage. Yes! a number of religious and state authorities are included in the fresco which were not in Nincheri's original sketch. Then, when the Lateran Treaty was signed in 1929 creating the Vatican state, the Difesa church wardens wanted to commemorate the historic event. Nincheri refused but relented when faced with losing the contract. Shortly afterwards WW II broke out, and the Canadian government took this work as evidence that Nincheri was a fascist. For a brief period, he was interned in Petawawa during WW II as an enemy of the state. Fortunately, Nincheri had many supporters who attested to his character, and he was soon released. controversial section of the dome was then covered up for many years.

The church was designated as a National Historic Site of Canada in 2002 and is located at 6800 Henri-Julien Avenue at the corner of Dante Street in the borough of Rosemont – La Petite Patrie. It is absolutely worth a visit and if you go, don't forget to go across the street to Pasticceria Alati-Caserta for their wonderful amaretti and Italian pastry.

¹ Fresco is Italian for "fresh". Plaster is applied to a wall or ceiling and painted on while wet and the colour is then absorbed into the drying plaster. If the plaster dries before being painted on, it is cut away and new plaster applied when the artist is ready to continue painting. Masters of fresco include Giotto, Masaccio and Michelangelo (think Sistine Chapel).





"History Is Painted by the Victors"

On at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts until March 8, 2026 is a wonderful display of Kent Monkman's work titled "History Is Painted by the Victors" and it's his largest solo exhibition to date. Monkman is a Indigenous Cree artist, originally an abstract painter, who returned to a representational painting because it enabled him to communicate with a broader base of people. He became interested in European painting when he realized that there was an opportunity to paint Indigenous experience and histories and authorize them into art history that pretty much neglected the Indigenous perspective.
